<p>1. Welcome and Introduction BW welcomed all in attendance.</p>	
<p>2. Apologies As noted above.</p>	
<p>3. Minutes of Previous Meeting and Matters Arising The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as a true record - proposed by Katrina Shalley and seconded by Kamil Tomzik.</p>	
<p>4. Local Priorities Local Outcome Improvement Plan (LOIP) updates:</p> <p>Children and Young People priority & CPT update PMcN stated that updates were contained within the Action Plan sent out with Board papers. Also highlighted information with regard to ongoing 2nd Clyde (Moodiesburn) Scout Group activities.</p> <p><u>LOIP Review</u> CB stated that preparation work was continuing. Community consultation scheduled to commence in March 2026. Stakeholder engagement sessions complete. Pre-consultation ended 12th December. Feedback has been reviewed and will help shape local priority consultation. Further details will be circulated in due course.</p> <p>Moodiesburn LMcR highlighted ongoing rat problem and fly-tipping in Moodiesburn. AMcP to contact Moodiesburn Community Action Group (MCA) to find out where this is concentrated. KS stated closure of the Pivot Centre has severely impacted community groups in Moodiesburn. LMcP mentioned play park opening on grounds of St. Michael’s PS planned for 4 March - MCA reps to attend.</p> <p>AMcP highlighted current Pivot CC works timescales: due to the complexity of the works involved, contractors requested to extend the tender period by two weeks. This will result in tenders requiring to be returned by 2 March but expected the contract will be awarded and for the contractor to take ownership of the site in late April/ early May ‘26.</p> <p>Further concerns raised about x3 bus service PMcN to contact First Glasgow. Library issue also raised – PMcN highlighted possible temporary solution at St. Michael’s PS. PMcN also highlighted that outdoor gym in the vicinity of Pivot CC to be opened in Spring ‘26.</p> <p>AMcP stated that the CCTV team have now procured three cameras which will be installed on the corner of the building at the Library as you enter the car park. The field of view will be along the side of the building towards Glenmanor Road taking in the entrance to the car park (Static Cam 1), with the second static camera covering the general car park area. A third Pan, Tilt and Zoom (PTZ) camera will be mounted on the rear wall / corner of the library to take in along the back of the building and the entire car park.</p> <p>Regarding Bedlay Cemetery, AMcP stated that site investigation outlining suitability of designated site for a cemetery received from developer on 13/02/26. used as a cemetery, but due diligence checks now being undertaken by cemetery team.

Community Transport

TA highlighted the following information:

First Glasgow have agreed to reroute service 38c to include Cardowan – now scheduled to start in June '26. Servicing the Crowwood estate area further highlighted as a key local requirement. Ongoing reliability issues with x3 service – Moodiesburn Community Action has attempted to contact First Glasgow to discuss. PMcN to contact First Glasgow re progress with 38c proposal and x3 issues.

Issue of SPT Bus service 310, now operated by ARG Travel, no longer starting from Moodiesburn is financially impacting residents who attend GP service in Glenboig - can cost up to £20 return taxi fare. Also, final 132 service each departing from Moodiesburn at 8pm during the week also impacting people trying to get or return from their place of work.

Glenboig Development Trust (GDT) and Cumbernauld Action for Care of the Elderly (CACE) discussing ways to improve community transport support across the Northern Corridor. Both groups involved in joint work since December '25 to bring older people together from Glenboig & surrounding areas and the wider Cumbernauld area.

Health Inequalities priority

Issues raised about new upgraded system at Jamieson Medical Practice. JS to raise and feedback any updates. LMcP highlighted improved afternoon service. JS further highlighted that 'Near Me' initiative was not used locally. Also stated that there are now 4 more GPs at Jamieson Practice. JS also mentioned current pilot online booking trial regarding Dermatology services. Online booking for GP services may be a future development. CAHMS provision has now increased in Chryston Hub rooms.

Social Integration and Inclusion

KT provided a sub-group and VANL service update. Reference made to transport survey that includes the Northern Corridor area. TA asked about what information is being collated in relation to transport as AW has not spoken to the Community Transport Subgroup. TA requested more information and any engagement work carried out regarding community/public transport be shared with Northern Corridor Community Transport sub-group.

Reference also made to Pivot Centre. KS asked why Pivot Centre issues were discussed outwith the Moodiesburn LOIP priority subgroup. Question also asked about why a separate inter-generational project had been set up when one is already in place via the Driving Digital Locally LOIP priority.

Issues also raised in relation to communication with VANL and VANL funding.

Subgroup organised and conducted a short questionnaire asking businesses, community organisations, groups and charities about local issues such as social integration and barriers to access in Northern Corridor. Results and feedback will be provided at the next meeting.

Police Scotland update

AM provided an update, including that PC Scott Douglas, Community Safety Officer, has continued to engage with Chryston High school to discuss safety and information inputs available from Police. He is also working with the school to deliver these sessions within their timetable where appropriate. Further updates at next Board meeting.

PC's McBain and Dudgeon will also attend primary school throughout the area and deliver inputs where requested. They are happy to deliver inputs or attend any other youth or social groups whether to talk about what the Police do or answer any questions that those attending may have.

AM also stated that meeting still to take place between Cllr McPake and Crime Campus due to an e-mail issue.

Scottish Fire & Rescue Service (SFRS)

GB highlighted No Foul No Fire initiative. KS requested further information to be forwarded. GL requested information regarding fire raising at Pivot Community Centre. Community Action Team happy to attend any community events. Also highlighted that deliberate fire-raising instances had dropped and that Service delivery review has been delayed until June '26.

During this input, LB and CA raised concerns about speeding cars and parking issues in Mollinsburn. GL suggested that a 'Walkabout' by Council officers and elected members, partners and local people should be organised.

Section 75 and Section 69 report AMcP discussed the spreadsheet sent out with meeting papers. PMcN explained that play contribution balances would be utilised via the Local Development Programme (LDP) process for spend only in areas where development funds have been provided. AMcP to provide further spreadsheet update.

Cllr Lennon raised issue about not receiving Board Papers. CB updated Cllr Lennon on the list for circulation but will double check this.

Housing application information

Housing have agreed to share relevant information on Council social media sites, including My Northern Corridor.

Northern Corridor Locality Profile update

Profiles are being developed as part of the LOIP review process and will be shared with Community Boards when engagement process begins in the coming weeks. Final draft of profiles expected imminently to be included in the LOIP review launch in March '26.

Dewar Road update

AK asked which section/location of Dewar Road is adopted and what section/location is not adopted i.e. confirmation that the unadopted section is from the Kilpatrick Drive roundabout to the roundabout at the Cumbernauld Road junction. AMcP confirmed that the section of Dewar Road that has not been adopted is between Kilpatrick Drive (Roundabout) and A80 Cumbernauld Road (Roundabout).

AK also asked who owns the unadopted section. Council's Legal team have advised that Crowwood Grange Estates own this section of road. AK also asked who is responsible for its adoption post-construction phase. AMcP stated that Crowwood Grange Estates would be responsible for having this road constructed to an adoptable standard to allow it to be adopted.

Regarding the subsidence of the carriageway and the lack of repair, AMcP stated Council considers this to be historic settlement of the road, our proposals would

be to build up this area and then monitor this over a period to confirm that the settlement has now ceased.

AMcP further stated that Crowwood Grange Estates are currently responsible for the maintenance of the landscaped verges, once the road is adopted this would be passed to the Council to maintain.

With regard to the long-term plan for Dewar Road concerning who pays to repair and maintain it and when might it be adopted, AMcP stated that our records show that there is a road bond (security) in place that can be used to complete/repair roads that have not been completed to an adoptable standard and we may be able to use this to pay for the remedial works here.

The Council has unable, so far, to get Crowwood Grange Estate to carry out this work. The Council's Legal team are now contacting the insurance provider who holds this bond to request access to this to allow the Council to carry out these works.

AMcP also advised that the Council has put together an estimate cost to repair this road (£190K) which will be passed to the insurance provider with the hope that this will now be accepted, allow the necessary works to be undertaken and thereafter for the road to be adopted by the Council.

Future updates will be provided when available.
