CRIME STATISTICS

During the last month 85 incidents were reported to Police in the Stepps area.

The following table shows a breakdown of the 19 crimes recorded as a result of these reported incidents;

IDENTIFIED LOCAL ISSUES

Following continued issues with speeding and dangerous driving. Traffic officers have been carrying out additional patrols in and around Stepps with a combination of marked and un-marked vehicles whilst also utilising the speed gun in problem areas.

There has been an increase in shoplifting at the CO-OP. Enquiries are on-going in relation to these with assistance from Police Scotland's retail crime task force and the Retailers Against Crime (RAC) group.

CURRENT CRIME TRENDS

Across Lanarkshire there has been an increase in high value vehicle thefts. Residents are reminded to ensure that all doors and windows are secured in their properties. Specialist officers are continuing enquiries and are carrying out plain clothes patrols during the hours of darkness.

COMMUNITY & SCHOOL ENGAGEMENT

Community officers attended Stepps Primary School in relation to complaints regarding parking. Although parking enforcement is carried out by North Lanarkshire Council, officers provided advice and assisted with bus parking.
